



OUR OBJECTIVES

South Shore Summer Theatre is committed to fostering inclusivity, accessibility, and artistic excellence in musical theatre. Our primary objectives include:

- Providing free, high-quality training and performance opportunities for youth aged 13-35, ensuring financial barriers do not limit participation.
- Creating a welcoming and inclusive environment that embraces diversity, equity, and inclusion, including support for LGBTQ2+ individuals and performers with disabilities.
- Employing local artists as instructors and mentors, contributing to the professional arts community in Nova Scotia.
- Expanding access to the arts in rural areas where opportunities are limited.

OUR GOALS

To achieve these objectives, we focus on:

- Producing high-caliber musical theatre productions that showcase young talent and attract audiences.
- Engaging the community through outreach initiatives such as pop-up performances, promotional events, and partnerships with local organizations.
- Building a sustainable future for the program through fundraising, sponsorships, and strategic partnerships.
- Contributing to the economic and cultural vitality of the South Shore and beyond by increasing arts participation and tourism.
- Continuing to grow and refine our training programs, ensuring young performers have the skills and confidence to pursue their artistic passions.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

In the spirit of reconciliation, South Shore Summer Theatre Association acknowledges that we live, work and create on the traditional territory of Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq People, and we acknowledge them as the past, present, and future caretakers of this land. South Shore Summer Theatre Association is grateful to have the opportunity to present in this territory. This territory, covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which Mi'kmaq Wəlastəkwiyik (Maliseet), and Passamaquoddy Peoples first signed with the British Crown in 1725. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but in fact recognized Mi'kmaq and Wəlastəkwiyik (Maliseet) title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations. We are all Treaty people.



Spring Awakening marked a year of significant growth and achievement for South Shore Summer Theatre. We expanded our team, strengthened our impact, and continued to provide invaluable opportunities for young performers and arts professionals.

Youth Employment & Professional Development:

- Hired two Canada Summer Jobs youth employees, reinforcing our commitment to youth mentorship and professional development.
- One of our youth employees, who previously shadowed our director, stepped into the role of official stage manager, demonstrating the success of our hands-on learning.
- Employed two university graduates as choreographer and vocal director, providing professional opportunities for emerging artists.

Live Music & Artistic Growth:

Re-introduced a live band, enhancing the production quality and providing employment to Nova Scotia-based musicians.

Community Engagement & Expansion:

- Increased our reach among young people, with several new performers expressing interest in joining our 2025 production following our final show.
- Recruited new board members, strengthening our leadership and governance.
- Secured new donors and sponsors, ensuring continued financial support and sustainability for future seasons.

Spring Awakening was a milestone production that reinforced our mission of accessibility, inclusivity, and artistic excellence, and we look forward to building on this momentum in the year ahead.

BUILDING ON OUR SUCCESS - OUR FOURTH SEASON

South Shore Summer Theatre is taking a major step forward by moving our 2025 production of All Shook Up to the Bella Rose Arts Centre in Halifax. This larger venue will allow us to showcase even more talent, broaden our reach, and engage new audiences while maintaining our strong presence on the South Shore. Our rehearsals will continue at the Mahone Bay Centre, ensuring that we remain accessible to local youth while creating new opportunities for performers from across the province.

This Expansion aligns with our mission to provide high-quality, accessible arts education and performance opportunities for young people, regardless of economic or geographic barriers. To support this, we are actively working to address transportation challenges that often prevent rural youth from accessing the arts. We are exploring carpooling initiatives, travel stipends, and partnerships to help bridge this gap and ensure that all participants can fully engage in the experience.

We are also strengthening our mentorship and training programs by employing professional artists, musicians, and theatre educators who will work closely with our young performers. Mark Ferraro-Hauck, Executive Director of Theatre Nova Scotia, has generously volunteered his time to direct our Bites and Broadway fundraiser--set to become our primary fundraising event for the year. Additionally, Cynthia Black, an experienced music director, is volunteering her expertise to help with vocals and music arrangements for the event. Their involvement not only enhances the quality of our productions but also provides invaluable learning opportunities for our participants, allowing them to work alongside seasoned professionals.

As we embark on this exciting new chapter, South Shore Summer Theatre remains dedicated to its core values of inclusivity, artistic excellence, and community-building. By expanding our production while maintaining our South Shore roots, we are creating a vibrant, welcoming space where young people can develop their talents, connect with others, and bring live theatre to even more audiences.




